INTRODUCTION

Our special mission

Have you ever seen a movie about a special agent? Usually, that agent has top skills and training, and they go on a mission, an important assignment or job to do.

When we choose to follow Jesus, we get an important mission too.

Before Jesus ended His time here on Earth and went back to the Father in Heaven, He gave His followers a mission. He told them:


"So go and make followers of all people in the world. Baptize them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach them to obey everything that I have told you. You can be sure that I will be with you always. I will continue with you until the end of the world."

— Matthew 28:19-20, International Children's Bible

By following Jesus, we accept His special mission: to share the good news of Jesus with everyone, everywhere, and teach others what it looks like to follow Him.

A missionary is somebody who goes and tells people about Jesus and helps them to grow in their faith. Many missionaries leave their hometowns and travel to other cities or countries to share about Jesus. But you can be a missionary too—and you don't even need to leave home.

We made this guide for you and your family to learn what it means to live out Jesus' mission, called the Great Commission, no matter where you live. For the next five days, we encourage you to gather your family together and go through each section of this guide—one section per day. You can meet after dinner or at bedtime, or even set aside a special time each day to talk about living on mission. We hope that each day you and your family can talk about what it means to live out our mission as Christians, and how you can start right where you are.



What Is Missional Living?

It all starts here

"So go and make followers of all people in the world. Baptize them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach them to obey everything that I have told you. You can be sure that I will be with you always. I will continue with you until the end of the world."

— Matthew 28:19-20, ICB

Imagine this: Jesus had just come back to life after being crucified. Many people had seen Him and they wondered what He would do next.

One day, He gathered his followers and gave them a critical mission: to go and tell others about Him, baptize them, help them become His followers (called disciples), and teach them how to live the way He taught. Then, right in front of their eyes, Jesus went up to Heaven to be with His Father.

What would you have done if you had seen and heard Jesus that day?

Jesus' followers accepted His mission right away. They traveled to different places, shared the good news about Jesus (called the gospel), and helped others believe in Him. As more people became Christians, they also accepted the mission. Soon, there were churches in different cities and countries. The number of Christians was growing fast.

But that was a long time ago. Do we still need to make disciples today? Yes! Jesus gave this mission to all of his followers, including you and me. If we follow Jesus, then it's our job, our mission, to share the gospel with others, and help others follow Him well, just like the first disciples did.

What Is the Mission Field?

Here, there and everywhere

Often, special agents have to travel to carry out their missions. They call this going out on the field. When Jesus gave His followers their mission, he also told them where they needed to go.

"But the Holy Spirit will come to you. Then you will receive power. You will be my witnesses—in Jerusalem, in all of Judea, in Samaria, and in every part of the world."

— Acts 1:8, ICB

Yesterday we learned about the mission Jesus gave to all His followers. Today's verse reminds us that His message was meant to be shared everywhere—places like Judea, Samaria and all around the world.

Some Christians, called missionaries, travel to faraway places to tell people about Jesus. These places are often called the "mission field." A mission field is anywhere Christians are making followers of Jesus. That means the mission field isn't just far away—it's wherever you are. You don't have to travel across the world to share God's love. You can be a missionary right now. Your school, neighborhood and even your home can be your mission field.

Here are three ways you can live on mission right where you are:

- Pray for people you know who don't follow Jesus.
- Find ways to serve (help) those people like Jesus did, showing them His love by caring for them.
- Invite them to come to church with you so they can learn more about Jesus.

How Do I Reach My Mission Field?



Now that we know where our mission field is, how do we complete our mission there? Think about the people in your mission field: your classmates, your coworkers and the people in your community. Even though you may not live near everyone on that list, the Bible calls these people—those in our mission field—our neighbors.

The Bible also tells us that part of our mission as Christians is to love our neighbors. One day, a man asked Jesus about this.

"But the man wanted to show that the way he was living was right. So he said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbor?"

— Luke 10:29, ICB

Jesus answered him by telling a story.

One day, a Jewish man was hurt and left on the road after being robbed. Two people walked by him without helping him. Then, a third man, a Samaritan, who usually wouldn't get along with Jewish people, stopped to help. He cared for the injured man and made sure he was safe. The Samaritan man showed love and kindness, even though his people did not get along with the Jewish people. Through his actions, he was a loving neighbor to the Jewish man.

Jesus told this story to encourage his disciples to be a neighbor to everyone equally, even those they didn't like or considered their enemies. When we care for others, like sitting with someone who's lonely, helping a friend, or sharing what we have with those in need, we're loving our neighbors the way Jesus taught. Being a good neighbor means showing His love to others and caring for them, no matter who they are. This is how we start to live on mission!

How Do **I Make Followers** of Jesus?





Who told you about Jesus? Did you hear about Him in church, from your parents, or from somebody you know? Today we are going to talk about the most important part of living on a mission: sharing the good news of Jesus, called the gospel, with others.

When God created the world, He made everyone and everything good. Sadly, people messed up and chose to sin, or go against what God wanted. This caused people to become separated from God, their loving Creator. But the good news is that God loved us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to take the punishment for our sin. He did this so that we could have a relationship with Him and be with Him forever. This good news gives us hope, and it's for everyone who believes in Jesus and chooses to follow Him.

"But before people can trust in the Lord for help, they must believe in him. And before they can believe in the Lord, they must hear about him. And for them to hear about the Lord, someone must tell them."

— Romans 10:14, ICB

Telling someone about Jesus is an important step in helping them follow Him. For some people, sharing this good news feels exciting; for others, it can feel a little scary. But no matter how you feel, God is always with you and will help you.

A simple way to share the gospel is by telling your own story—how you met Jesus and what following Him means in your life. Another way you can share Jesus with someone is by inviting them to church. There are also lots of tools to help you start a conversation about Jesus with others you can find some helpful tools at the end of this book.

Just remember, your job is to share—only God can change someone's heart and inspire them to believe in Him. That part is up to Him!



Here are three things you can do to help fulfill your mission, the Great Commission, right now.

1. Pray for those who are in your mission field.

Ask God to help you love and care for the people in your mission field. If they have needs, pray for God to meet those needs and look for ways you can help them.

2. Serve the people in your mission field.

Look for ways you can be a neighbor to somebody in your mission field, like the Samaritan in the story we read earlier this week. You can even serve together, showing love by meeting needs and helping others as a family. This can look like volunteering in your community or helping out a friend or loved one. Look for ways to serve your neighbors or community through local charities or your church.

3. Share Jesus with someone else.


Choose a person in your mission field and share Jesus with him or her. You can share your story with them, invite them to church or use a tool to start a conversation about Jesus with them!
