

# Enthusiasts At Home Kit

**Thank you for sharing Jesus Film Project® with others.**

When you tell people about how God is changing lives through Jesus Film Project, you're not just telling a story, you're a part of it. We hope the items in this kit help you spread the word and invite others into our shared mission to bring the hope of Jesus to everyone, everywhere.

This kit includes a variety of resources designed for different situations—from casual one-on-one conversations to group presentations and events. Review the information below for ideas and brief instructions on how to best use each resource.

Here's what this kit includes:

## **Stickers**

Stickers are a great way to start a conversation about Jesus Film Project. Put them on a water bottle, laptop, car or anywhere people might notice. This kit includes two sticker designs. Choose one or both to hand out at an event or give them to someone after a conversation about the ministry.

### **How to print your stickers:**

- Download a sticker file to your computer.
- Send the file to an online sticker-printing shop (such as [stickermule.com](https://stickermule.com), [stickerapp.com](https://stickerapp.com) or [uprinting.com](https://uprinting.com)).
- Note the shapes: one design is a **die-cut** (unique shape) and the other is **circular**—choose the correct option when ordering.
- Check the file name for the **recommended printing size** before you submit your order [ex: (At Home Kit) Sticker - The Story of Jesus is for Everyone Sticker (**3 in**)].

## **Slide Presentation**

This “About Jesus Film Project (JFP)” slide presentation gives an overview of who we are as a ministry. Use it as a visual aid when talking about our ministry with an audience. When presenting, we encourage you to make this presentation your own—share why you care about Jesus Film Project and include stories that have inspired you.

### **How to use this presentation:**

- Download the presentation to your computer.

- Open the presentation using PowerPoint (if using a PC), Keynote (if using a Mac) or Google Slides.
- Use the available technology to connect your computer to a large screen, sharing each slide as you give the presentation.
- After your talk, pass out stickers or flyers so people can take something home to remember your talk and Jesus Film Project.

## **Flyers**

A flyer is perfect for placing in areas where lots of people pass by—bulletin boards at church, the breakroom at work, community centers—with permission, of course. Post them or hand them out after a conversation about Jesus Film Project to keep the connection going.

### **How to print your flyers:**

- Download the flyer to your computer.
- You can print at home or send the file to a professional shop (like FedEx).
- For the best quality:
  - Print the flyer called "(At Home Kit) Flyer - Get Involved with JFP" on "5.5 in x 8.5 in" size paper in full color (4-color), using white paper.
  - Print the flyer called "(At Home Kit) Flyer - JFP Full Page" on "8.5 in x 11 in" paper (letter-size) in full color (4-color), using white paper.

## **Postcards**

Postcards are a simple and personal way to talk about Jesus Film Project. Give them to friends, family or supporters, or use them like smaller flyers to hand out at events. They also work well to keep at your desk to give to anyone who shows interest in learning more about our ministry.

### **How to print your postcards:**

- Download the postcard to your computer.
- You can print at home or send the file to a professional shop (like FedEx).
- Print in full color (4-color) on 4"x 6" (102x152 mm) postcard-quality white paper (such as 100# cardstock).
- Print as many as you'd like to hand out or keep on hand.
